Weather Challenges The Work

So far, we have not been hit with a cyclone, but incessant heavy rains have caused disruptive flooding in the north, east, and the central regions. The Christians farmers complain that they cannot work the land, but the rain continues to fall. We have only received calls for help with medicines.

In the rainy season, I cannot go to the provinces. It is difficult for men to come to Mampikony or Mahajanga because they are busy farming and providing for their families. The best time to go there is in June or July after the harvest. It is also difficult and dangerous to travel with the state of the road and the rent of an SUV or 4x4 is so high. In the meantime, I'm sending Bible studies.


